## From the President's Desk

Hi,

Early on Friday, Olga and myself were pleased to attend at Santa Sabina College, a twilight fair for support of the women and the Community Trust of Kopanang, a community group in a poorer area 55km south of Johannesburg. The focus of the fair was the sale of crafts and artworks of the woman who are raising funds for their community, in the bleak mining area of Ergo. In their craft and art they draw support from each other many who struggle with health and family problems. HIV/ AIDS has impacted on the community. The sale proceeds are for the community group. The project was commenced by Sister Shelia. This project has not been missed by Rotary, the Rotary Wahroonga, Club of being an International Project for the Club and Sister Shelia an honorary member. We are richer from the fair, seeing the support, of school families, many of whom have left the school, but cannot leave this community group. We left with a small Christmas tree addition, a reminder of the ladies coping with troubles, supported in spirit and kind from Australia. Also lots of emails and texts, the modern prayer!

A reminder, our Christmas Party at Nonna & Co Restaurant, is this week 6.30pm on Thursday. Olga, Penny, and Maree, plus others, are bringing it all together. It will be a fun night.

### Last week's speaker: Jay Thorogood

Last Wednesday, we were joined by Jay Thorogood of the Rotary Club of Darling Harbour (The Darlings), who spoke to us about the Rotary Solar Lights Program.

The Program was started by Mr Graham Boler of the Sutherland Rotary Club and seeks to provide environmentally friendly lights at a low cost to help people around the world without electricity.

We often take the electricity we have at home, work and school for granted, however, if we just take a moment to realise that 1/4 of the world population live without gridconnected electricity and 16% of the world population does not have access to any electricity at all, it certainly makes you realise just how lucky we are!

People in countries with little or no access to electricity rely upon Kerosene lamps to light their homes and schools, however, this presents the danger of serious burns, house fires and lung damage from fumes.

In response to this electricity challenge, the Rotary Solar Lights Program seeks to provide heavy-duty lights to communities without electricity. The lights provide twelve hours of light from a single charge.

The lights are often taken in suitcases by Rotarians on trips. They are relatively small and lightweight, but provide a much-needed resource to developing countries and communities.

The program is a RAWCS project and the lights themselves are something the Strathfield Rotary Club could look into as a future project!

### ${\cal R}$ affles Roster

#### Vale John Watkins 29th October 1938 - 11th November 2018

John was inducted into the Rotary Club of Strathfield in June 1979 with a classification of AUTO SERVICES during Peter Foss's year. He retired from the Club in 2011 due to ill health. In 1990 he was named a Paul Harris Fellow by the late PP Max Douglas, mainly for starting the very successful Xmas Community Chest run by Strathfield for several years before being taken over by Burwood Rotary Club. He is perhaps the only Scots Bellevue Hill boy who played rugby for his school and then went on to play league for Parramatta. We all remember John as a very quiet achiever who always looked exhausted when he arrived at a meeting after a hard day at his service station. After more than 30 years in Rotary he will be remembered fondly by many Rotarians, both current and ex.
