\mathcal{W} hy attend a Rotary meeting at our Club?

In previous bulletins I mentioned about attendance and also about being part of the Rotary meeting team. The constitution says the only 30% of our attendance need be at our own club. This means that if we have 45 regular meeting each Rotary year there could be 13 Strathfield Rotary Club meetings that you are obliged to attend. Sounds like a lot meetings you can miss at our Club doesn't it? Well vou could be absent from our Club and still be involved with Rotary to the tune of 100% attendance if you had 'make-ups' or if on a minimalist concept just bring your overall attendance to 50%. Also, if you wanted to, you may take the 85 rule to extreme and practically never attend a meeting at our Club. From time to time we all have good reason not to attend meetings. Does it matter if you don't attend local Club meetings? Of course it does!

The heart and soul of Rotary is the concept of our Club. This means sharing the load. In a previous article I pointed out 20 'must do' items that some Rotarian must undertake to make the Club meeting work. I noticed that at last meeting that the

Rotarian who hangs up our banners also managed to get the down lights shining on the banners. The meeting room looked very Rotarian. By the way don't forget that if the banners are hung they also have to be taken down and stored. Are you there early enough to see who puts them up? Do you stay long enough after the meeting to know who the Rotarian is that takes them down? If there was an emergency could you do this job? Do you know where the banners are kept? Do you know where the rest of Rotary paraphernalia is kept? For that matter would you be able to take over one of those 20 duties (see bulletin 18 July 2018) emergency? Do you know what has to be done?

We are lucky at our Club because there does seem to be someone, a Rotarian, available to carry out one of these 20 essential meeting duties in an emergency; we have 44 members and we do get around 20 members at most meetings. Have a thought for those clubs who have less than 20 members to carry out those essential 20 meeting duties. Now that's not 20 members attending the meeting but

less than 20 members on the books. Believe it or not, more than 25% of Rotary Clubs in our District have a membership of less than 20 members. I would imagine its 'all hands on deck' for Rotary meetings at these Clubs.

Now there is another reason to attend a Rotary meeting at our club; sharing the costs. This is no more evident than when we have a special event partner's night. There are lots of items that increase the cost of these functions, no less than 'guests of the Club'. This financial burden is overcome by hiking the cost of the meal. Rotarians who bring a guest or partner are burdened not only with the increased costs on their own meal but also that of their guests. It's unfair

that the whole club membership doesn't shoulder these costs and that willing Rotarians have to pay double or more through the payment for themselves and their guests. Also while we are mentioning finances, what about our fines sessions and raffles and regular levies on our meal at dinner meetings? Those who do not attend the Club meetings are seeming abrogating some of the Club's financial responsibilities.

There is no time like now to share the fun, duties and responsibilities of Club meetings. A good Rotarian is a good Club meeting attendee.
