Club members, together with their partners, Peter Smith (Captain), Rod, Janelle, Sue Byrne, Raymond, and Gulian distributed and collected kits to 20 local pharmacies, even beyond Strathfield. The project was over months, April to June 2019. The Club's participation was part of National Bowel Scan and the Kits collected are forwarded onto for testing and reporting back is to the participant's doctor. Bowel Scan is a national health project, as many of us have received birthday kits from the Australian Government. In fact there is one on the top of my desk, waiting for me... Found it!

In reporting the Club's participation, I learnt that Rotary Bowel Scan program was first developed in 1982 in Lismore, northern New South Wales by a local doctor and member of the Rotary Club of Lismore, Dr Bill Brand, who identified the need for a low cost, easy to use diagnostic test for bowel cancer.
