THE idea of spending seven days at a retreat in Springwood with a group of people I had never met before was initially quite daunting.

Hawkesbury Rotarian Bob Duncan had approached the Gazette late last year with an offer for a placement in the Rotary Youth Leadership Award program.

I was quite enchanted by the RYLA reputation. I'd heard people say RYLA had changed their lives. Well, I can't say RYLA changed my life, but it certainly heightened my appreciation for life, and it confirmed my love of new and different experiences.

By the end of the week, I found myself intrigued and inspired by the experiences, achievements and hardships my new friends and I shared.

Each year thousands of young people take part in RYLA activities all around the world. Nominees chosen for their leadership potential are sponsored by a local Rotary club to attend an all-expenses paid camp, seminar or workshop, to learn and practice new skills. Throughout the week we embraced guest speakers who talked about leadership, public speaking, selfmotivation, goal-setting, conflict resolution, stress management, team work, , communicating with the media, group dynamics, relationships, and negotiation. We depended on each other to get through many activities, including physical and mental challenges. We entertained each other with performances and games. But most importantly, we supported each other through the more difficult aspects of the course, and in the end we, were all winners, accepting each other for our differences, strengths and difficulties.

At one point he was frozen with fear, clinging midway to the wall for about 20 minutes, but with support and encouragement from the group, he made it to the top.

"Making new friends and meeting different kinds of people was the greatest part of the camp," he said. "When I first got there I was a bit nervous because of all the new people, but by the end of it, I was crying because I was so sad to be leaving everybody."
