Last Week's Meeting

Pattie Rose from the Salvation Army thanked the club for the support over many years and expressed the appreciation that the Salvos have for Rotarians and their involvement in the Red Shield Appeal.

This year's appeal is on Sunday 28th May and Pattie encouraged members to provide assistance in any form possible.

This year's door knock target is \$7 million with 100,000 collectors Australia wide.

The total fundraising target is \$59million.

Pattie provided the following figures which give an insight into the achievements of the Salvation Army. Every week they provide:

- ➤ 180.000 meals and 20.000 food vouchers.
- ➤ 3,500 beds and 600 blankets for the homeless.
- ➤ 800 people were given refuge form abuse
- ➤ 4,000 people are helped with phone counseling

By supporting the Red Shield appeal we can help the Salvos continue their wonderful work of assisting those in need.

President Elect Rod McDougall presented a cheque for \$1,000 to **Paul Van de Ven** the principal of Chalmers Road School.

Paul thanked the club and explained that the money would be put to good use in providing additional resources for the special needs of the students attending the school.

Guest Speaker Mr. Glenn Anthoney

Graham True introduced our guest speaker Glenn Anthoney whose topic for the evening was Motor Bikes and Motor Cycle Culture.

Glenn's career has been varied, starting out as a boilermaker, then accountancy and now works on computer systems.

After he obtained his first motor bike at age five it was not long before he had his first accident in which he broke his leg. But he has maintained a passion for bikes throughout his life. Believing that it is "in your blood"

He has had many bikes but his favourite is his current Harley Davidson. He has not been a member of any club but has observed many at close range.

Glenn spoke about the irony that some members join bike clubs to seek freedom but are soon bound by strict codes of territorial behaviour. Most clubs have a hierarchy of power with the need to "earn one's stripes", with colours and patches worn as badges of honour.

There are outlaw clubs and Christian clubs and many others in between.

Quite a few do good work within communities being involved with children and organising fund raising activities.

Glenn also expressed concern about the changing culture of some clubs, who are now recruiting young down and out gang kids by using inducements of things such as bikes which they could not normally afford.

Kevin Beltrame thanked Glenn for his forthright comments and presentation.

The Way It's Done Around Here
