## SHOEBOXES FOR EAST TIMOR

Fellow Rotarians,

I must begin with a huge thank you to all in the district who have taken this project on board. I am absolutely overwhelmed by your support and know that you will make an even bigger impact on the children who will receive your gifts. As Rotarians we really can make a difference.

I have received many phone calls (as has PDG Ken Nicholls) and so I wish to give you an update on the project's organisational issues:

- \* Ken tells me that the container will not now leave until October so you still have plenty of time to get those boxes filled and delivered.
- \* DIK will be open nearly every Saturday for acceptance of the boxes. If you need to deliver at other times please phone Ken on 8814 7175 and organise a time that is mutually convenient. Ken is only 1/2 hour away from DIK.
- \* Boxes other than shoe boxes are acceptable (some are buying similar boxes that are pre-decorated) as long as you keep roughly to the 5 categories for the contents: something to wear/ eat/ play with/ draw or write with and on/ hygiene item.
- \* Ken has lots of brand new tins (like the old Arnotts biscuits round tins) which have an Australian animal motif on the top which he suggests could also be used for the purpose. You may need to be a little more innovative in the way that you fill them.
- \* The address for DIK (Donations In Kind) is: corner of The Great Western Highway and Reservoir Rd, Prospect. (There is a red fire engine in the corner.)
- \* Some people are also putting together school kits for use by the teachers eg. soccer balls, books and other team sports equipment or educational equipment.

Don't forget to let me know how you are going. I am aware that some clubs are doing the box assembly as a fellowship activity and including their children/grandchildren in the project (Penrith is having a transferred meeting with a sausage sizzle barbeque at someone's house but still charging normal dinner fees and using the extra money to buy goods for the boxes); some have undertaken to include their local high schools in the project; others are using it as a community project for badges for their scouting groups and the like; one member used it as an activity for the elderly to participate in and they loved it too! As you can see we are only limited by our imagination. Congratulations again. Your in Rotary Service
