LAST WEEK'S GUEST SPEAKER

Grahame True introduced Rob Edwards, Chief Executive Officer of the Australian Direct Marketing Association (ADMA). ADMA represents over 500 of Australia's leading corporations with membership comprising advertisers, suppliers and on-line marketers. Rob recently completed four years as President of the International Federation of Direct Marketing Associations (IFDMA). Rob was a Production Manager with Unilever and then took a position as General Manager with K-Tel. The direct marketing industry spends \$B12 per year and employs 600,000 people. Each person in Australia sees 7000 advertising messages each day. The aim of the industry is to use data management to target consumers receptive to the product being marketed.

ADMA has also helped in developing regulatory legislation to protect privacy and the "Do Not Call Register" legislation passed by federal parliament on 22 June 2006. The register will allow individuals to formally optout of receiving unsolicited telemarketing calls in a legally binding way, with a fine of \$50,000.
