LAST WEEK'S MEETING

Our Guest speaker was Dr Clarence Hardy, secretary of the Australian Nuclear Association, and President of the Pacific Nuclear Council. Dr Hardy is an eminent respected person in the Australian Nuclear industry, having spent 35 years in the industry, including 20 years at Lucas Heights His subject 'Public Perception of Nuclear Energy' has become a matter of discussion as the public becomes more aware of the problems of greenhouse gases relating to carbon dioxide emissions and fears of dramatic climate changes. He spoke on the economics of nuclear generation of electricity, safety issues, waste management, potential terrorism issues and the sustainability of supplies of raw materials. There are 440 commercial reactors operating worldwide, and many more being built. 80% of energy in France is produced by nuclear power stations. There has been two major accidents with nuclear reactors - 3 Mile Island in 1979 & Chernobyl in 1986, both caused by poor design structures.

In the opinion of Dr Hardy, solving the problems of global warming revolve around wind power (expensive & irregular wind), 'clean' coal (expensive), solar power (relies on sunshine) which leaves nuclear power as the only possibility if we are to leave the world in a better place for future generations.

ROTARY INFORMATION

This year District Governor Harley Tarrant is promoting to our District a Rotary Club Global Project, **ShelterBox**. ShelterBox brings relief to victims of disaster on a worldwide basis by providing humanitarian aid and relief in the form of material and equipment that provides shelter, warmth and comfort to people displaced by natural and other disasters for a prolonged period.

Each box is uniform in size, and normally contains a 10 person tent, 10 sleeping bags, a multi fuel cooker, water purification tablets, a torch & batteries, spade, rope, plastic bags and other items a family would need after losing everything in a disaster

ShelterBox was the idea of Rotarian Tom Henderson of the Rotary Club of Helston-Lizard, Cornwall, UK, and in 2000 his Rotary Club adopted ShelterBox as their Millennium project. Each complete box costs only \$1200.

The first 50 ShelterBoxes were despatched to Gurujat in India in February 2000 after the earthquake, since then over 35,000 ShelterBoxes have been distributed worldwide providing shelter for more than 350,000 people.

Recently D.G.Harley received a cheque for \$6,250 from PDG Jack Elliott OAM, Eastern Region Treasurer of Rotary Australia World Community Service Ltd, to be added to donations being received for ShelterBox. Incidentally this donation was given to Jack via the Rotary Club of Nepean who received it from a private donor.
