## LAST WEEK'S MEETING

Guest speaker Jason Carroll, Manager of Suttons Chullora & Homebush, was accompanied by Karyn. Jason has worked for Suttons for 20 years, progressing from washing cars to his present position. Suttons are a hard but fair employer, and many staff, including his father, have had up to 40 years service.

The General Motors Company is the #1 automobile manufacturer in the world, closely followed by Toyota. However only parts of the organisation are profitable, GMAC (the finance arm) and GM Holden Company. GM also owns Saab, Suzuki and Daewoo.

The founder of the Sutton Group, Sir Frederick Sutton (knighted for his services to the blind) was a compressor mechanic in Temora until, seeing the future in motor vehicles, sold up everything in Temora and moved to Homebush in 1948 to set up Suttons Motors. Chullora was opened in 1964. They employ 80 staff at each site and have ongoing business dealings with 336 local businesses (including P.P.Keith Byrn). Currently the company employs 1200 staff over 21 divisions. As well as being the #1 Holden dealer in Australia they also sell product from Porsche, Ferrari, Subaru, Chrysler, Jeep Toyota, Audi, as well as Isuzu and Hino trucks. Motor Vehicle dealerships are lucky to

get a net return of 2%, and many are losing money.

GM-H has recently released the Holden VE Commodore, the "billion dollar baby', the componentry cost being 3 billion dollars. Fuel consumption is 10.9 litres per 100 kilometres on the base 6 cylinder model which compares more than favourably with the 4 cylinder Toyota with consumption of 9.9L per 100Klms. A station wagon and a 'ute' will be launched next year. The 'Captiva', an "SUV" just for soccer mums and the 'Epica' to replace the Vectra are also to be launched. Final comments, there are 1200 variations of the Holden range, GM is working on a hybrid vehicle, the use of Ethanol E24 – 76% petrol, 24% ethanol will be the future benchmark & 1 million new cars will be sold in 2006, 80% of which are imported.
