#### LAST WEEK'S MEETING

The guest speaker Bob Sendt, the recently retired Auditor General NSW was introduced by Charles Pitt. The Auditor General is a 7 year appointment responsible to the NSW Parliament for audits and related services under the Public Finance & Audit Act 1983, the Corporations Act 2001 & other NSW Acts. The Audit Office was established in 1824.

The Audit Office whose mission statement 'Assisting Parliament to improve the accountability and performance of the State', assists the Auditor General in fulfilling this role which is 'Without Fear or Favour in keeping Governments Accountable'.

The Audit Office conducts audits and prepares annual financial reports for 450 public sector agencies, which are provided to the Minister responsible; to the agency itself; to the Treasurer and to Parliament. The Audit Office does not cover Local Government.

The Audit Office conducts in depth reporting of all public agency activities in order to determine whether an agency is carrying out activities efficiently, effectively, economically and in compliance with law, but does not comment on the merits of government policy.

Identified barriers to better performance are lack of incentive for greater accountability, bloated monopolies, lack of framework for reporting performance, and poor governance models and

practices. Solutions may include private/non government partnerships & better risk management Bob was thanked by P.P. Angelo Franco
