LAST WEEK'S GUEST SPEAKER:

The guest speaker was our District Governor, Marilyn Mercer. DG Marilyn gave an overview of her time as a Rotarian since joining Rotary in April, 2003. Prior to that, Marilyn had a good understanding of Rotary as her husband Dudley has been a Rotarian for some years. Marilyn's first encounter of the work of Rotary was 18 years ago when she was a head teacher of science and agriculture. She was endeavouring to have a shade house constructed at her school. The Rotary Club of Windsor became involved and members built the shade house – bigger and better than that imagined.

DG Marilyn then talked about the theme of Rotary this year "Building Communities Bridging Continents". Rotary International President Ray Klinginsmith says this is about "Unity without Conformity". He also says that we should be looking at different things in our Clubs and questioning if we are doing things effectively. DG Marilyn listed some of the significant things that the Strathfield Club have been involved with during recent years. She included the Spring Fair, Edmund Park, ANZAC Day Breakfasts, donation to the people of Moree, Polio Plus, Carols, gardens at the MS Studdy Centre, Youth achievement awards, Trish Foundation golf day, Club web site, Meridan Shelter Boxes - just to name some of the great achievements of Strathfield Club. "Bigger, Better, Bolder Rotary"

Bigger – need to grow. There are 1.2 million Rotarians yet every few years that many Rotarians are lost. An initiative of the DG is to hold a membership day on the 16th October this year. More information will be forwarded shortly about that day. Membership is all about achieving a goal – we can't be complacent.

Better – is better education for everybody. Another initiative is the leadership institute- the focus will be on learning more about Rotary, which will be useful for incoming Club Presidents. Note also that there are now five avenues of service. A Bolder Rotary - 17 Australian Districts have pooled funds for a PR campaign. Grant applications will be available for Clubs to run their own PR programs. "All this towards a Bigger, Better, Bolder Rotary in 2010-11"

Other news from the DG - This District has an additional Assistant Governor. This year there will be five Presidents

meetings and the Assistant Governors will meet with Club Presidents in between those. Marilyn noted that some new club (in the Northern Sydney District) meet every two weeks – it is all about providing a balance. DG Marilyn noted that it is great news that in our local area David Martin (who has been a guest speaker at this Club) has been selected as part of the GSE team. Marilyn explained the process of selecting GSE team members. There are two outbound teams this year - one to Taiwan and the other to the Philippines.

Strathfield can be congratulated for its contribution to the Rotary Foundation - \$2400. Note also that $\frac{1}{2}$ of this comes back in three years to the District to be used for selected grants. Marilyn also noted the number of Paul Harris fellows in this Club. As well Marilyn noted that Strathfield Club pledged \$2,000 for the Polio Plus program. DG Marilyn talked about the school pinkie day project - the purple painted little fingernail. The purpose of this project is to raise awareness of inoculation for school students . "Purple with a Purpose" - give \$1. Marilyn raised \$250 with the catchcry "I'll tell you if you give me a dollar".

DG Marilyn mentioned her support for the District Literacy project – called "Book Buzz". The Fred Hollows Foundation is a partner in this project. The goal is to increase the literacy levels of children in the Northern Territory. Packs of books can be purchased in a bundle of \$146. Of interest to members - Bill Boyd is the International RI Development representative and is Chair of the Rotary Foundation worldwide in 2011 DG Marilyn displayed with reverence the District Governor's Jewel which has been presented to every District Governor. This District was first known as number 269, then 969 and now 9690.

Dudley Mercer then had his turn is addressing the Club members – and this was concerning the upcoming District Conference (Bathurst 18th – 20th March, 2011). There is a project to obtain musical instruments and to make these available to young people in need, such as those in juvenile justice centres. The project is called Music Box and it is in conjunction with the Australian Children's Music Foundation. The symbol is a rocking horse known as "Rocky' which fits in with the theme of the conference "Rock Rotary to its Foundations" So anyone going to the Conference is invited to donate any kind of musical instrument that they no longer use.
