The President's Column

Well my first Club Assembly, as President, last week provided much constructive criticism – in particularly in regard to our membership numbers and the declining attendance at dinner meetings.

Elsewhere in the bulletin will be a more detailed report on the evening – the views and opinions expressed will give the Board a good idea in where our energies should be directed.

However, membership and participation should not be solely the responsibility of the President and/or the Board – we, as members of Strathfield Rotary, all have to take an active part in retaining members and finding and introducing new members to our club.

As mentioned, at the club assembly, it is proposed that we hold "theme" (for want of a better word) nights during the year. We will initially concentrate on an Accountants night where we will have a high profile professional from the accountancy or insolvency field – and then invite all the local accountants to attend (maybe be as our guests?). We would then perhaps have a solicitors night, a medico night etc. And why not a "neighbours night"? - where every member has to invite a potential member from their own street or near neighbourhood.

Also as explained last week the club's weekly bulletin has had to undergo a facelift – the bulletin as prepared and presented by Trevor Duxbury was a first class production – it was very professional and was extremely well received by the members. However, it was also time consuming to produce. Estimates will vary but I am confident that no less than 10 hours per week into its production (Trevor was ably supported by a number of sub-editors and reporting staff). Darrell Slater, our Club Services Director, having approached a number of Rotarians to undertake producing the bulletin, without success, had no other alternative but to produce it himself. Darrell will ensure that the bulletin will stay relevant and timely – albeit in a reduced format. However, if there is anyone out there who is prepared to help please put your hand up!

Our guest speaker this evening is Rick Brown who will speak on education in Uganda and in particular his hands-on role in building a much needed new school for the young Ugandans. Please make Rick welcome.

DIRECTORS NOTICES / CLUB ASSEMBLY REPORTS:

Club Service - President Peter advised that the weekly bulletin will be reduced in size as no one is willing to take on the significant weekly task of producing the bulletin in its present format. Suzanne Freund will produce a periodic newsletter for partners. President Peter expressed disappointment that Darrell Slater has had to take on both the Bulletin and the Program. Noted that David Martin has agreed to assist with the Program in the future.

Community Service - President Peter noted that Bradley Ayres would be making arrangements in connection with the Spring Fair and the Christmas Carols.

President Elect - Trevor Duxbury advised that he would start planning his year from January 2011 and would welcome member's suggestions. He flagged that obtaining new members and fostering fellowship would be central considerations.

Vocational Service - Doug Potter advised that the Club would be putting forward a candidate, Miss Louise Lin, for the National Youth Science Forum. Planning was under way for the Police Officer of the Year awards night. The Pride of Workmanship night has been moved to March 2011. Doug hopes to arrange a workplace visit during the year.

Youth Service - Kevin Beltrame advised that planning for the year is well in hand with his team in place and his budget approved.

International Service - Ian Johnson advised that the GSE Team Leaders have been chosen for the two outward bound teams leaving in February 2011 for Taiwan and the Philippines. Applications for team members close on 13 August 2010. Shelterbox in Australia is to launch on 31 July 2010. The box donation amount has reduced to \$1000-00. A letter of thanks has been received from St Jude's School for donation of \$2000-00.

OTHER COMMENTS

Several members then spoke about their concern about declining membership attention and participation:—

- 1. Noted that in the Club's history the tide had come in and gone out at various times. At present t he tide was definitely out.
- 2. Mention was made that the South Strathfield Bowling Club was closing soon. The club had been a meeting place for the Club in the past. It was suggested arranging a night at the club for a wake.
- 3. Felt the time had come for the board to formally request members who were non active to make their intentions clear. Leave of absence procedures were available for those not able to participate in meetings and projects and these should be more strongly enforced.
- 4. With an aging membership, the Club was less attractive to individuals seeking professional networking opportunities and supported the planned vocational theme nights which it was felt would be of interest to younger prospective members.
- 5. Club was active in the past but has become non active. Expressed the view that in general members must be active to wear the Rotary badge.
- 6. Reminded meeting that some members who seldom attend meetings do give generously to the Club if asked. Will this cause a dilemma for the Club in adopting a membership policy?
- 7. The view was expressed that the Club is in crisis. Even though we have 56 members only half that number or less turn up for our weekly meetings. The changing

demographic of the Club was noted. It was even proposed closing down the Club and starting afresh. It was time to set realistic goals and to do something about achieving them.

- 8. It was suggested a yearly album of photographs be presented to the outgoing President at the end of his/her year. Suggested holding an International Day to raise funds.
- 9. Expressed the view that non active older members were entitled to wear the Rotary badge in recognition of past service.
