#### What is Probus

Probus is a "community service program" of Rotary. The word "Probus" is an amalgamation of "pro" in "profession" and "bus" in "business", which also made up the Latin word from which "probity" is derived. Since the formation of the first club in the UK in 1965, Probus has spread to 22 countries around the world and there are now 1,796 Australia-wide clubs. Probus clubs can only be formed by Rotary, but once the sponsoring Rotary Club presents the President of a newly formed club with the certificate of accreditation issued by the Probus Centre -South Pacific Inc., the club is self governing, but must remain within the limits of its Constitution.

#### Structure of Probus clubs

Probus clubs are:

- simple in structure
- non political and non-sectarian
- open to persons of good character
- · non profit making and non fund raising
- free from the constraints and obligations of service clubs

#### **Probus Club of South Strathfield Activities**

Currently activities include:

- A general meeting on the second Monday of each month, commencing at 10:00 am.
  - (this comprises a club business session, a coffee break followed by a guest speaker)
- Day outings generally on the fourth Monday of each month to places or organisations of interest to members.
- An annual 5 to 6 day trip in October.
- Occasional fellowship lunches and BBQs.
- Christmas lunch on the second Monday in December.
- Annual general meeting on the second Monday in March.
