

LAST YEAR, FLOODING IN CAMBODIA KILLED 247 PEOPLE AND DISPLACED MORE THAN 200,000 FAMILIES. AS FLOODWATERS RECEDED, DISEASES SUCH AS CHOLERA AND DENGUE FEVER EMERGED. THE ROTARY CLUBS OF ELTHAM, AUSTRALIA, AND PHNOM PENH, CAMBODIA, COORDINATED THE DISTRIBUTION OF AQUABOXES — TANKS THAT CAN PURIFY UP TO 290 GALLONS OF CONTAMINATED WATER — TO FAMILIES, MEDICAL CENTERS, AND SCHOOLS.

CANADA

MALARIA, TUBERCULOSIS, HIV/AIDS, AND ILLNESSES
CAUSED BY LACK OF SANITATION HAVE DEVASTATED MANY
VILLAGES IN SOUTH AFRICA. IN RURAL HLUVUKANI, THE
NONPROFIT KUNAVELELA COMMUNITY PROJECT
MAINTAINS A COMMUNAL GARDEN TO HELP NOURISH
RESIDENTS AFFECTED BY DISEASE. LAST YEAR, THE ROTARY
CLUB OF BOWEN ISLAND, B.C., PLEDGED TO RAISE FUNDS
TO PURCHASE AND INSTALL A WINDMILL, WATER TANKS,
AND A BASIC IRRIGATION SYSTEM TO SUPPORT THE GARDEN.
BOWEN ISLAND CLUB MEMBERS, WORKING WITH THE
ROTARY CLUB OF BURNABY, B.C., RAISED MORE THAN
US\$12,000, AND THE VILLAGE NOW HAS A RELIABLE
WATER SUPPLY.
