Club Secretary Report on the February 5 Club Assembly

 Further to the comments made by President Suzanne in last week's Club Newsletter I submit the following as an abstract of the decisions taken as a result of the brainstorming process that took place on the night.

Introduction:

 There was more than a fifty percentage attendance of members on the night (i.e. 29 Rotarians) It was recommended during the Assembly that some sort of communication be made with the entire Club membership following the meeting (i.e. 2unction2aire by email)

Outcomes:

- Members present were supportive of the "club's operation": (i.e. Venue and day of week) there was "no problem" encountered in this respect
- President elect Allan Teale presented the position: "Are we doing the Basics of Rotary Membership" (i.e. Providing <u>service</u> to community and beyond)
- Past President Steve Taylor recommended that meeting procedure revert to saying Rotary Grace and not attempting to sing "The National Anthem"

Concerns:

- The documented roles of members by Club Directors are not well communicated to them. Hence the Committee Membership procedure is not implemented fully
- As a consequence, Members' networking inside and outside the Club falls short of expectations and therefore benefits to all concerned
- As a further consequence, Director's networking and follow-up reporting from District personnel is not communicated proactively
- Deadlines are not being met as a result of the first three concerns (as listed above)
- Declining Club membership deserves appraisal by all active members, though the point was made emphatically that District Clubs of 20-30 active membership are providing quality programs and support. This appraisal was supported by the evidence that:
- Present day business people are not living in the District as they did forty years ago

- Cultural nature of the Strathfield District is not what it was twenty years ago
- Cost of membership annually, for a prospective young professional is in the 3unction of \$3 000 and is a prohibitive amount to be met, as there is an indifference in some quarters because of family commitments and subsequent time factors and present day lifestyle
- Complacency needs addressing in offering support of Club initiatives
- Club Projects are needed by the membership, and the Graffiti Project as an example of same, is not being fully supported.
- Watch this SPACE for follow-up and implementation throughout the Club membership.
