### **Rotary International District 9675 International Service**

With the expanded District we are well positioned to serve our international Community in more effective way than we could have as 2 small Districts. In this edition you be able to read about some of the great work Rotarians from our District is doing to help people in communities that are less advantaged as us. We will endeavour to keep you informed about what some of the International Service projects are.

We have a great team in International Service with a wealth of knowledge, experience and passion.

During the 2013-14 year DG Garry has 6 projects of collaboration where Clubs in our District unites to support these projects to get a "bigger bang for the buck". One of these will be supporting the University of Sydney's Isin-Di'ak Fund. This fund has been set up with the overall objective of improving health outcomes in Timor-Leste. The Governor of NSW, Prof Marie Bashir AC is the patron of the fund.

One of the first major projects of the fund will be the elimination of lymphatic filariasis, a very nasty, mosquito transmitted, parasitic disease. This is the disease that causes elephantiasis – the gross swelling of limbs and other parts of the body. It is very

### **Rotarians Against Malaria**



Mosquito nets help keep mosquitoes away from people, and thus greatly reduce the infection and transmission of malaria. The nets are not a perfect barrier, so they are often treated with an insecticide designed to kill the mosquito before it has time to search for a way past the net. Long Lasting Insecticidal Nets (LLINs) are estimated to be twice as effective as untreated nets, and offers greater than 70% protection compared with no net. The distribution of mosquito nets impregnated with insecticide (often deltamethrin) has been shown to be an extremely effective method of malaria prevention, and it is also one of the most cost effective methods of prevention. LLIN's have the advantage of protecting people sleeping under the net and simultaneously killing mosquitoes that contact the net.

24th August 2013 The Len Avard award is a Perpetual trophy that is awarded to Rotarians who have done exemplary service work in RAWCS, Jack has for many years continued his magnificent role as the Eastern Region **RAWCS** Treasurer accounting & managing millions of dollars paid in by Rotary Clubs and others, this involved the payments for goods and services internationally, Jack reflects on the past 10 years when RAWCS Eastern Region would handle approximately \$300K annually, today however in recent years this has shifted dramatically where Eastern Region alone is now managing finances well over \$13M annually and it continues to grow. Jack's reason for this exceptionally large amount of money through RAWCS bank account is because Rotarians and our allied partners know these funds get to where it was destined.

Jack was presented the Len Avard Award by RAWCS District 9675 Chairperson Lloyd Chatfield at the RAWCS Eastern Region Meeting at Gloucester In August. Jack is a member of Parramatta Daybreak Rotary Club.
