



The Towns we aim to help.

Lightning Ridge is a town in north-western New South Wales, Australia, in Walgett Shire, near the southern border of Queensland, about six kilometres east off the Castlereagh Highway, and is served in commercial activities by the town of Walgett - some 75 km to the south. In 2001 it had a population of 1,826, of whom 344 (18.8%) are Indigenous Australians and 1,304 (71.4%) are other Australians. Paul Hogan was born in Lightning Ridge. Lightning Ridge is an important paleontological site, with fossils dating back to the Cretaceous period, 110 million years ago. The sandstone rock once formed the bottom of a shallow inland sea where the remains of aquatic plants and animals were preserved.

Walgett is a town in north-west New South Wales, Australia and the seat of Walgett Shire. It is near the junctions of the Barwon and Namoi rivers and the Kamilaroi and Castlereagh Highways. In 2011, it had a population of 2,267, of whom 1,003 (44.2%) are Indigenous Australians and 1,927 (85.0%) other Australians.

Walgett takes its name from an Aboriginal word meaning 'the meeting of two rivers'. The current signage at the outskirts of the town indicates a population of 2,300 (December 2008) and an elevation of 130 metres. It is a regional hub for the wool, wheat and cotton industries and is the gateway to the New South Wales opal fields. The main crop farmed in the district is wheat, however the drought has caused an increase in the farming of lucerne and other good hay crops.

Let's all think about this and expect a follow up
