The Club had distributed a STRATEGIC PLAN that was due for evaluation by 2014. Not aware of this document having been evaluated at that time, or in fact during the course of its four year currency.

The current Rotary year, 2015-2016 was introduced to the STRATEGY 360 document with a launch to a meeting of Board members and their partners prior to the commencement of that year. The first Club Meeting in June 2015 introduced members to STRATEGY 360. A Report covering the first six months of STRATEGY 360 has been circulated to Club Directors who each have a copy which can be distributed to any club member wishing to read the eight page evaluation. An Agenda Item appears on the Business Paper of the next Board Meeting scheduled for Wednesday 17th February, when a future Club Strategic Planning Committee will be devised. Decisions taken at the Board Meeting held Wednesday 3rd February included:

- Changeover Date has been set at SATURDAY 25th June, 2016 to be held at the Strathfield Golf Club, Centenary Road, commencing at 7pm
- Following the Club Meeting held earlier on Wednesday 10th the Board undertookTo continue its investigation towards the formation of a local Rotaract Club with support of the District Rotaract Representative and Rotarians Ed and Usha
- Discussion follow-up pertaining to concerns remaining over the Lime Raffle of May 2015. Director Bradley Ayres will pursue this matter further regarding ticket sales of this closed competition
- The Board noted that RI had allocated \$2 753.12 in the name of Strathfield Rotary towards credits of the Rotary Foundation and Polio Eradication
- The Board agreed to the allocation of \$500 to District ROMAC for presentation to the Representative, Maria Moran, the speaker at tonight's Club Meeting.

Solomon Islanders 17 year old Roselyn Jatobatu and her mother Anna have lots to smile about after life-saving heart surgery following a unique collaboration of Australian

humanitarian and medical experts at Sydney Adventist Hospital (San).

Coping with life limiting breathlessness and fatigue and facing an uncertain future due to a serious congenital heart condition, Roselyn was operated on at the Hospital after a call to arms by Rotary Oceania Medical Aid for Children (ROMAC).

"The San was able to offer to meet accommodation, theatre, and other health expenses" said San General Manager Brett Goods.

"We have some great humanitarian medical specialists with a long history of volunteering their medical skills so we made the calls, explained that without the surgery the prognosis for Rosleyn was not good, and as expected the medical and surgical teams immediately committed their time and expertise."

San Cardiothoracic Surgeon Dr Ian Nicolson AM who recently featured on Channel Nine's 60 Minutes program for his voluntary cardiac work with the San's own Open Heart International led the surgical team. Other members included Anaesthetist Dr Brad Smith, Perfusionist Dr Bong Joon Huh, and assistant Dr Luke Timmermans.

ROMAC has transformed more than 400 lives since its inception 27 years ago identifying children who could not otherwise access surgery, facilitating medical assessments, transport, host families, hospital, medical, surgical and other support.

"We are reliant on people with big hearts" said ROMAC Operations Director Barry Wilson.

"Roselyn could not have the surgery in the Solomon Islands so we had to look here. The San has helped us before with needy patients and we are so thankful they could again. Roselyn will be going home happy and healthy, ready to go back to her school and to help create a good future for her Island."

Brett Goods says the \$35,000 plus donation of hospital services for Roselyn's care complements the work of the San's Open Heart International program which coordinates teams of Australian volunteers to operate in medically disadvantaged countries.

"Roselyn's case is just another example of how caring individuals can do good in the world. It reminds me why I love working at the San." www.romac.org.au


