2015 \$2 REMEMBRANCE DAY COIN, UNCIRCULATED



This coin, introduced to the market today, is Australia's fifth full colour circulating commemorative

\$2 coin. It is a poignant tribute to those who have served Australia during times of conflict, inspired by the poem "In Flanders Field" by Lieutenant Colonel John McCrae, 1915. This could be the coin that will commence your Centurion Tower Collection as some will be available for distribution tonight, on this REMEMBRANCE DAY, 2015, the day of their introduction to circulation.
