## TALES OF THE CITIES COMES TO STRATHFIELD ROTARY

Find out why Berlin is boring, New York is nothing special and why Scandinavia sets a standard the rest of the world can only hope to match when travel writer and journalist Mitchell Jordan addresses Strathfield Rotary this month.
Jordan, (pictured), who has been writing for Burwood Scene since 2006, will deliver a speech about the importance of both expanding our horizons and why community journalism still matters in an age of social media saturation.
"I'm looking forward to sharing my stories with a live audience and hopefully telling them a few things they may not find in Lonely Planet" he said. In addition to Burwood Scene, where he rose to the role of deputy editor, Jordan's travel writing has been published internationally in The Epoch Times and in CNN. He believes travellers need to think beyond the tourist traps - especially if they have any interest in writing about their experiences.
"After visiting 30 countries and working abroad I can say that it's often the most unassuming places that leave the greatest impression," Jordan explained. "I believe that cities like Berlin really suffer from their own hype. I'm much happier in modest Helsinki where the tourist attractions are fewer and the chances of being surprised are endless."

As part of our continued efforts to increase our public outreach and measure results, I am pleased to report that Rotary received widespread media coverage throughout 2015, with more than 500 articles in 20 countries representing a 33 percent increase in coverage from 2014. Roughly 75 stories appeared in top tier international news organizations, including eight out of the 10 most influential ranked by Forbes, such as the Associated Press, Agence France Presse, BBC, CNN, Reuters, The New York Times, The Washington Post and Wall Street Journal.

Rotary's social media presence was strong in 2015. Rotary and End Polio Now Facebook and Twitter channels gained more than 125,000 fans and followers. Overall, there was 46 percent increase in reach across all Rotary's social channels from 2014 to 2015 .
