A year before the Armistice was signed in 1918 the Rotary Foundation was implemented. Rotary International Chairman of the time, Arch Klemph, proposed an endowment for the purpose of doing good in the world.

His vision became the Rotary Foundation. Rotary President Elect John Germ, who was present at a Foundation Dinner at the Epping Club last week made the following points concerning the Foundation prior to the presentations:

- This century US\$123m will be allocated
- There is presently US\$1b in the Endowment Fund
- To date RI has spent \$1.4billion US on polio eradication

Polio Eradication

universally best known program of the Rotary Foundation is Polio Plus, the eradication of polio initiative which began in 1985 and is now hopefully in its final stages. Not so long ago the world was paralysed by the fear of polio. More than 125 countries were polio endemic and thousands of families watched in anguish as the disease killed crippled or thousands of people a day, mostly children.

For thirty years now Rotary and its partners such as the World Health

Organisation, UNICEF and the US Centres for Diseases Control have worked tirelessly to rid the World of polio. So far Rotarians have raised over \$1.3 billion US to help fund the program. Since 1985, more than two billion children have received the vaccine, and five million children destined to be polio victims are walking today because of global immunisation. Reported cases have dropped 99.8 percent and only two countries. Afghanistan and Pakistan remain endemic.

SALUTING OUR POLICE

As they have for many years, the Rotary Club of Strathfield hosted the Police Officer of the Year Awards night to honour officers from the Burwood and Flemington Local Area Commands.

Community recognition of the often fearless and always dedicated duty that police officers carry out is considered highly by the NSW Police, so much so that the guest speaker on the night is always the Commissioner or a Deputy Commissioner.

For the 2015 Awards, held on October 28 at Strathfield Golf Club, Acting Deputy Commissioner Geoff McKechnie said he understood the value service clubs provide. "Our communities are looking for leadership. The police must do that. It is so important," he said.

The Deputy Commissioner, who is responsible for regional NSW, which covers 60 per cent of the state, also spoke directly to the police nominees urging them to keep seeking education and leadership experiences.

"The key for me is decision making and it's no different for the constable on the street. We can't be afraid to make choices. We apply our thinking and knowledge to that process. We make a choice then commit, execute and review," "Be the example and you can change people's lives."

Local Area Commanders (LAC) Superintendents Mark Jones, Burwood, and Phil Rogerson, Flemington, were present to congratulate the nominees from their stations.

The Burwood LAC nominees were Senior Constable Denis Dreon, Constable Kimberly Sutton, Sergeant Danielle Johnston, Constable Martha Stavely-Smith, Constable Derek Pontois and Sergeant Anthony Traino.

Burwood's 2015 Police Officer of the Year was awarded to Constable Derek Pontois for his "A list" duties, which included bringing a major fraudster to account for trading in fake gold and catching the offender before he boarded a plane to China.

The Flemington LAC nominees were Sergeant Jennifer Byrne, Leading Senior Constable Leah Collins, Leading Senior Constable Anthony Richards, Senior Constable Paul Aishou, Senior Constable Daniel Warner and Sergeant Karen Baldwin. Flemington's

2015 Police Officer of the Year was awarded to Leading Senior Constable Leah Collins for her work with Domestic Violence victims and offenders, including bringing 13 counts of DV charges.
