Details of decisions taken at the Club November Board Meeting:

- PDG David Croft with chair the Club AGM on 2 December, commencing at 6.30pm

- Rotarian Arie Pappas will assume the future classification of Marketing.
- Advice from District informed members that the Ranfurly Book Aid Project would be discontinued due to lack of projected future funding. Our Club representative,

- Rotarian Janelle Watson, has been advised accordingly.
- The Board agreed to the funding of \$500 to the School for Seniors so that the Computer Program, assisted by PP Raymond McCluskie, could maintain the internet connection in particular.
- The Board agreed to co-operate with the Burwood Club to provide funding for parents of four Students of Strathfield South Public School to be involved in a talented students local secondary schools' science experience.
- The President indicated that arrangements were in hand to join with the three local Probus clubs, originally sponsored by our Club, to celebrate Fortieth Anniversary of Probus in the South Pacific. A Wine Tasting Event has been arranged for Wednesday 23 March, 2016. Details to follow.

- A report has been tabled suggesting that members indicating their weekly attendance has benefited the ordering of meals for the Club considerably. Unfortunately, we continue to have members who are not taking attendance notification seriously.
- The President will represent the Club at the District AGM and Presidents' Meeting at the Liverpool Catholic Club, Friday 2 November.

'Why are some positions some positions held for only 3 months'

My response to this question relates to the four quarters of the STRATEGY 360, introduced this Rotary Year. Strategically, it has been shown that administrative positions occupy the four discrete quarters are:

> * Sergeant * Raffle Co-ordinator * Program Co-ordinator

* Weekly Fees Collection Co-ordinator * Weekly Attendance Co-ordinator

My observations have shown that:

- 1. Rotarians who have held one of these positions for a year are in a prominent position to provide quidance service to a less experienced operator
- 2. There is always the opportunity to continue in the position beyond the set period of three months to heighten one's skills and abilities
- 3. This is an opportunity for newcomers to be involved in a worthwhile aspect of Club service while serving their 'apprenticeship' with regular activity.
- 4. This can be the best way of providing a service to fulfil the weekly need to provide a service for the benefit of the Club.

Members' use, or lack of use of the term "Leave of Absence" when reporting, or not, their movements, has been brought into closer focus since the introduction of the need to advise weekly of attendance at Club meetings. It will be assumed that, as of 1 January 2016, a member has not been allocated leave of absence until he or she has:
