emporary solutions often situation worse. Speeding away from police at a random breath test may buy you a few more minutes of liberty, for example, but the consequences of that decision will only compound an existing problem.

Given the severe time constraints suffered by many modern parents, temporary solutions are frequently the only solutions available. Fast food takes the place of proper meals, and so on.

As new research reveals, parents are increasingly liable to make up for their lack of engagement with children due to long work hours by overcompensating at Christmas.

"Because mum and dad work hard, the attitude towards their children is: 'You shall enjoy your life because of how hard we work.' And that means iPads and Xboxes for the kids," demographer Bernard Salt told The Saturday Telegraph.

Yet this, just as in the case of our runaway driver, only leads to further problems. According to that new research, nine in 10 parents now believe the gift expectations of their children are becoming increasingly "unrealistic", and six in 10 admit their kids are receiving gifts they do not "fully appreciate".

In other words, in attempting to have a way of making a make up for lack of quality time with our children, we're creating a generation of spoiled materialists. This cannot be good for parents or children. Parenting expert Justin Coulson puts it in chilling terms. "If we are consistently spoiling them year-round," he warns, "then they will turn into the Kardashians or Paris Hilton." If that doesn't scare parents into action, nothing will.

> Fortunately, there is a solution. And all it requires is some focus and discipline — from parents rather than their children. Instead of only giving expensive gifts this year, consider also giving the gift of experience. Charities can always use some assistance over Christmas/ New Year, perhaps helping out in storerooms or even joining in the direct task of distributing goods.

> Elderly relatives and neighbours might appreciate an offer of mowing the lawn or grocery shopping. Teachers and sports coaches would definitely appreciate a handmade gift. There are so many different ways to enhance Christmas without resorting to big spending.

> And, of course, there is one gift that is valuable beyond measure. Spend more time with your children - at Christmas and throughout the entire year. Nothing from any store can beat it.
