### Last Week's Guest Speaker: Michelle Davies & Emma Spencer

We are all very fortunate people, we have been blessed with happy, bright

healthy children, and we have been fortunate to have them educated at excellent schools in Strathfield, with top class facilities, fairly new buildings designed by top architects, and with top line teachers and amazing educational, sporting

and cultural programs.

Amongst this almost educational excess though is a humble little State School with 65 students – Chalmers Road School. Chalmers Road was built in the 1970's, looks its age, and quite honestly doesn't look like it has had a maintenance or improvement dollar spent on it since. There are areas where children play open injury due to wear and tear, and age.

The Principal, a passionate educator, and young mother is Michelle Davies, and she, along with teacher Emma Spencer, were our speakers on Wednesday August 9th.

In preparation for Michelle's talk I visited Michelle at the school last Wednesday and given a tour. The reason that there are only 65 students is that all of them are moderately or severely mentally affected, and require a huge level of support just to get them to school, and to assist them in interacting with other students.

The school is Kindergarten to Year 12, and the school is broken up into three areas The Junior School, the Middle School, and the Senior School.

The teachers and support staff at this school are amazing. They have no time

off, have to contend daily with a varying range of scenarios, some unpleasant.

In her talk to us Michelle outlined the need for individual iPad's for students, as a major improvement in

learning, and a number of areas where she would like to make small but significant improvements to the facilities for the benefit of both staff and students.

I hope during this year that our club may be able to assist Chalmers Road through obtaining grants, undertaking some working bee's at the school, repair or replace some needed equipment, and perhaps get some much needed modifications done.

Additionally, I strongly recommend that ALL members visit the school, look at the great work the teachers are doing, how much the kids appreciate visitors, and look at the areas that will be identified as needing improvement.

I apologise for this not being a regular speakers report, but Chalmers Road is a most special place, and it needs our help.
