$\mathcal D$ o You Know?

More than a billion people -- onefourth of the world's population -- are unable to read. Illiteracy of adults and children is a global concern in both highly industrialised nations and in developing countries. In the United States, one quarter of the entire population is considered functionally illiterate.

The number of adult illiterates in the world is increasing by 25 million each year!

The tragedy of illiteracy is that those who cannot read lose personal independence and become victims of unscrupulous manipulation, poverty and the loss of human feelings that give meaning to life. Illiteracy is demeaning. It is a major obstacle for economic, political, social and person development. Illiteracy is a barrier to international understanding, cooperation and peace in the world.

Literacy education was considered a program priority by Rotary's original Health, Hunger and Humanity Committee in 1978. An early 3-H grant led to the preparation of an excellent source book on the issues of literacy in the world, "The Right to Read". The book was the forerunner of a major Rotary program emphasis on literacy promotion.

In 1985 the RI Planning and Research Committee proposed, and the RI board approved, that the Rotary clubs of the world place an emphasis on literacy education. Many Rotary clubs are thoughtfully surveying the needs of their community for literacy training. Some clubs provide basic books for teaching reading. Others establish and support reading and language clinics, provide volunteer tutorial assistance and purchase reading materials.

Rotarians can play a vitally important part in their community and in developing countries by promoting

projects to open opportunities that come from the ability to read.
