Speaker previous week: Jack Britton

Jack Britton is the Manager, Customer Experience at the Strathfield Public Library. Jack has been at the Strathfield Library since late last year. Prior to that, he held several positions of senior librarian in both council and university library settings.

The official opening of the newly refurbished Strathfield Public Library

was held on 29th June this year following major internal renovations to study spaces and services.

Study spaces have been reorganized into a "study stadium" with bright new furniture and lounges to fit with modern study styles. Technology wise, there is a new learning laboratory where users can borrow laptops with a docking station available. The printing and scanning facilities have been upgraded with a new 3D printer.

An exhibition space called the "Iron Bark Gallery" has been incorporated within the library with the intention of holding exhibitions by local artists each quarter.

The smaller group study rooms, including the Ironbark Room, have also been refurbished with new audio-visual facilities, though it was noted that due to the current health situation these facilities will not be available to community groups at this time.

Local studies and history still form a core part of the Strathfield Library Services, along with Storytime and the Book Club. Access to online resources via electronic databases also forms a vital part of information available to library users.

Book lockers are available to collect and return library loans. All items returned to the library are handled carefully by the library team and items are quarantined prior to going back on the shelves.

Overall a very informative talk on the local library.
