Speaker from two weeks ago: Lísa Moloney

Last Wednesday week, we had the privilege of hearing from Ms. Lisa Moloney, Principal of MLC Burwood, our keynote speaker for this gala evening. Her frank and honest

presentation of the challenges and achievements in her professional and personal life to reach where she is today made mesmerizing listening.

She believed that while legislation protected women's right to be treated equally, the often unconscious belief that women need to lead like men to be effective was still

prevalent and this is what women need to keep challenging. She spoke about not letting other's opinions about your personal choice of dress or hair influence you and believed in leading by example.

There were moments in her life where a simple thing such as speaking gently and working co-operatively with emotional understanding was seen as a weakness for management roles. In rare instances, she was advised to be more firm in her communications to take on leadership, clearly based on such perceptions.

When asked for her opinion on an often debated topic of co-ed school vs single sex

school, her calm response and advice was to focus on understanding the child's individual personality and the need to take that into consideration and consult with the child in the selection of the school.

Ms. Moloney was proud of the achievements of her (MLC) girls. Under her leadership, MLC School has been named the No.1 IB School in Australia and figured among the top 50 Global IB Schools in 2021. This came in backdrop of the fact that she had previously taught only in co-ed schools.

In concluding, she noted that women need to continue to

#choose to challenge inequality to harness their full strengths and capabilities and in doing so build an Australia committed to the equality of women in every way.

(Ms Lisa Moloney is an educator, with over 30 years experience in Australia and overseas. Her early education was in music (double bass) followed by higher education in Environmental Science, Educational Leadership and advanced studies through the Harvard Graduate School of Education.)


(VR), Augmented Reality (AR) and Optical Character Recognition (OCR).

Rotary Club of Kings Cross and the Kiribati Child Malnutrition Project

The Kiribati Child Malnutrition Project is being supported by the Rotary Club of Kings Cross. Peter Marzec has provided the following information on the Project for the interest of Strathfield Club members and a possible joint project between clubs.

- 7% of children less than 5yo are malnourished and 3.5 % are wasted i.e. too thin for their height
- Warwick Nelson (Kings Cross Rotary International Services Director) has been working closely with Ruth Cross (President,

Rotary Club of Tarawa) and the Honourable Tinte Itinteang (Ministry of Health & Medical Services) to understand the problem and options on how and what kind of support Rotary could provide.

- It will be a big project to solve a big problem so we are looking to tap into the support of:
 - o Other Clubs (in Aust and internationally)
 - o RI
 - o Corporate Sponsorship
 - o Govt support Federal Aust /NZ

- o NGOs
- o Rich Listers/Philanthropy

A powerpoint presentation is available which highlights the nutritional deficiency amongst the population in Kiribati and its impact of anaemia and stunting and then the possible intervention programs and the way forward with assistance from Rotary and other organisations.
