Easter Island is part of the Polynesian group of islands, though it is a territory of Chile. The island is 23 km long and 4 km wide and composed of extinct volcanoes.


Harry spoke of the known history of the island and the statutes.

Harry has visited the Island twice – in 1987 and again in 2008. He said that of the over 800 statutes, there are only two that he has not sighted. Each of the statues having recently been allocated a number.
