#### DG Visit:


District Governor Warwick Richardson is scheduled to visit our club on the 16th of September. Looking forward to his visit.

An updated My Rotary that's faster, easier to navigate, and

accessible on your mobile devices launches later this month. Here are five ways the new My Rotary will make your job as a club officer a bit easier:

- 1. Streamline accounts with ease. The updated registration process makes it possible to match existing records and eliminate duplicate accounts for the same person.
- 2. Quick access to your club pages. When a member signs in, their home menu will provide access to pages that display information about their club, including its finances, goals, and reports. As a club officer, you can easily update meeting information, add club officers, and make changes to your club's roster right from your homepage.

- 3. Add detailed meeting information. Not only can you add the time, place, and format of your club meetings, you can also list the many ways your club interacts. This level of detail makes the new meeting search capabilities more robust.
- 4. Find members and clubs quickly. Looking for a Rotarian you met at the Rotary International Convention? Thinking of visiting another club's meeting during your vacation? You can use My Rotary to search for a member or club. Member profiles may include a person's name, club, role, and contact information, depending on their settings. Club profiles, which are displayed on a map, include meeting times, locations, and the meeting language.
- 5. Secure your personal information. When you create your member profile, you determine what information you want to share and with whom.

# Out and About: Sydney Cancer Survivorship Centre Concord Hospital

Last Wednesday we welcomed a guest of Peter Smith, Brother Jude. Known to Peter for over 25 years, Jude was an educator at ACU for about 40 years and just prior to retiring he was awarded an AM. With some 30 publications to his name, he had interesting lecture tactics and one of them being never to use a microphone - the theory being that his students had to be quiet to catch his words. He is also a cancer survivor and often meets Peter at the Concord Cancer Survivorship Centre. He recently wrote a piece on Cancer Survivorship which is give below:

The diagnosis of cancer consumes a person's energies, health and life. As patients we lament this major change to our health and wellbeing. We experience very deeply the challenges cancer presents in terms of our overall sense of self and life.

Shock and anger are often our initial reactions as patients to the news of the cancer. We ourselves, together with our family and friends, realise that life as a cancer patient will be a very different journey and path. Our family and friends are very important companions for us on our new journeys. Together as patient, family and companions we enter a new phase of our life journeys.

Our shared commitment, hope and life together with our own personal sense of the spiritual are central to our being positive in this new phase of our life journeys as cancer patients and as family and friends. Our journeying together beyond the diagnosis to a new sense of life and hope is our key focus

The Sydney Cancer Survivorship Clinic is integral to our new journeying. At the Survivorship Clinic a very specialist and dedicated group of doctors, clinicians, exercise physiologists, dietitians, nurses, artists, musicians, researchers and yoga trainers walk with us as cancer survivors. The atmosphere is rich in hope, life and in people's concern for each other
