Speakers from last week: Julian Day & Bruce Wren

Julian Day, CEO Consensus Group, Australia

The Consensus group focuses on recognising excellence through a range of programs and Innovation Awards with many award winners going on to achieve worldwide success. Two such companies being Allassian and Wisetech.

The Awards are in their 22nd year with the awards being held now twice each year. All of the 185 award judges are industry experts. There are 12 award programs covering a variety of technology – from the Innovation Awards to FinTech, Software, GreenTech, AgTech, EdTech, MedTech plus others.

An independent evaluation of the Consensus Award program was recently undertaken by the School of Global Management which assessed how successful the award winners have been. Evaluation results indicated that 90% of winners have gone on to be successful around the world. Some businesses have been acquired by bigger

companies though many are still operating in their own right with 82% still privately owned companies.

The success factor for these companies was deemed to be 72% right product, at the right time and in the right place.

Bruce Wren CEO, 1WordFlow

Bruce's organisation 1WordFlow helps companies manage their information in a web and mobile world. The objective being that all of your information is available online, on mobile and on demand.

Bruce's company was the winner of a Consensus Innovation Award in 2020. Bruce told the audience that winning a Consensus Award has cachet due to the heritage of the awards and the fact that it is an Aussie award. He continued by saying that Aussies are good at invention (eg WiFi and Black Box), but often these inventions get more financial backing from overseas that from onshore.

Technology has to have to have a purpose – to problem solve. Often a website looks good until one tries to navigate to the required document. Documents available on web sites have so much content, it is difficult find the particular segment of information that you want. The format needs to be changed to something more convenient.

Documents that are easy to access is the next wave — with tomorrow's document a webpage that you can click to directly to access the relevant information that you need. The objective is to have Instant access to any page, any document, in any language,

and on any device. Instead, many companies are still more focused on content rather than usability.

Speaker for this week: Narelle Brown

Narelle joined the Energy and Water Ombudsman NSW as Community Engagement officer in 2007.

Narelle has always been involved in community organisations and volunteering. Financial counselling took her interest in 1986 which lead to 18 years of working for low income and vulnerable consumers and establishment of programs and changes in the credit and debt industry. She has developed many community programs along

the way and also contributed to Rotary's Young Driver Program in its early stages in 1998. Narelle established the first hardship program for a major retailer which is still operating today. She studied Financial Counselling and Management at UWS and also achieved a Post Graduate in Dispute Resolution. Narelle has always volunteered in some capacity – at present it is as dog training instructor for the Hills Dog Training Club – a side passion!
