#### LAST WEEK'S GUEST SPEAKER

Our scheduled guest speaker was Peter Bourke who was to speak to the Club on "Ranfurly Library Services". Unfortunately, Peter was taken to hospital this week and was unable to attend.

Terry Rohan stepped into the speaker's position and told the Club of his recent travels to Tasmania and then to England and Prague. Terry was introduced by Janelle Watson.

Terry initially spoke of the great family get together of him and Stephanie, their 4 children and their respective partners along with 10 grandchildren who spent 2 weeks together at Bateman's Bay. Following this Terry and Stephanie set off for Tasmania via Melbourne where they spent time in Launceston and Hobart, then off to Port Arthur where he had first met Stephanie some 45 years ago. They also did the historical train trip from Queenstown to Strachan, the gateway to Tasmania's World Heritage area.

Following their return to Sydney Terry and Stephanie undertook the 25 hour journey to London where they stayed for a time with their daughter.

The next move was on to the Continent where they travelled to Prague in the Czech Republic. Prague

has a population of 1.2 million and is the capital of the Czech Republic which was formed with the peaceful separation of the former Czechoslovakia into the Czech Republic and the Slovak Republic in 1993. The Czech Republic is landlocked and surrounded by Poland, Germany, Austria and Slovakia. The Czech Republic was admitted to membership in NATO in March 1999 and into the European Union in May 2004

The city of Prague had its beginnings in the 9<sup>th</sup> century with the building of the Prague Castle. The city has 4 defined areas - the old town which was established in the 13<sup>th</sup> century, the lesser town which was established in the 14<sup>th</sup> century, the castle area (Hradcany) and the Jewish quarter. The Hapsburg dynasty ruled the area from 1526 until 1918 and this was known as the Golden Era. The area was occupied by the Nazis during WW2 but fortunately no damage was inflicted by them. After WW2 it was under communist rule until 1989.

Prague has been described as the Heart of Europe and is a beautifully preserved city with amazing architecture, stunning old buildings, narrow winding streets and many famous sights. The Czech people are also renowned for there breweries and good wholesome food. From a tourist point of view it is also a cheap place to visit.

After experiencing Prague Terry and Stephanie returned to England where they ventured to the wilds of Cornwall.

Terry was thanked by Paul White.

Dear Strathfield Rotary Members,

I hope you and your families are all well and I am really sorry for not writing earlier on. I'm starting to get really busy studying; HSC is not even in a month. I'll finally end high school on the 29th of June and then I can start something new! So I really can't wait for HSC to be over. So for next year (it actually starts in October in France), I think I will be studying international business but I don't know where yet. I have been already admitted to a school in Montpellier in the South of France and I'm still waiting for the results from Toulouse (I had to do an exam last week end for it). So I'll let you know when I'll choose. I realized that doing a gap year in a foreign country was a really big advantage to enter good universities. So I'm so pleased I did it because it's now helping me a lot. So summer is coming here and the weather is a lot better now, we finally had more than a week with sun and everyone is wearing shorts and tops instead of big coats and jumpers! #### PLANE TESTING?

A brand spanking new Airbus 340-600, one of the largest passenger airplane ever built, sits just outside its hangar in Toulouse, France, without a single hour of airtime on the clock. Enter the Arab flight crew of Abu Dhabi Aircraft Technologies (ADAT) to conduct pre-delivery tests on the ground, such as engine runups prior to delivery to Etihad Airways in Abu Dhabi. The ADAT crew taxied the A340-600 to the run-up area. Then they took all four engines to takeoff power with a virtually empty aircraft. Not having READ the run-up manuals, they had no clue just how light an empty A340-600 really is. The take-off warning horn was blaring away in the cockpit because they had All 4 engines at full power. The aircraft computers thought they were trying to take off, but it had not been configured properly (flaps/slats, etc.). Then one of the ADAT crew decided to pull the circuit breaker on the Ground Proximity Sensor to silence the alarm. This fools the aircraft into thinking it is in the air. The computers automatically released all the brakes -and set the aircraft rocketing forward! With the result that the Abu Dhabi Aircraft Technology crew had no idea that this is a safety feature so that pilots can't land with the brakes on. Not one member of the seven-man Arab crew was smart enough to throttle back the engines from their max power setting, so the \$200 million brand-new aircraft crashed into a blast barrier, totaling it. The extent of injuries to the crew is unknown due to the news blackout in the major media. This was because coverage of the story was deemed insulting to Muslim Arabs. Finally, the photos are starting to leak out. £200 million aircraft meets wall. Wall wins.
