LAST MEETING'S GUEST SPEAKERS

Last Wednesday we had the official visit by DG Paul Erickson. Paul was accompanied by Suzanne and was introduced by PDG Harley Tarrant. Paul is currently the Principal of Kingswood High School and is an old 'Apexian'

Paul's address started with the concept of what is a good Rotarian and what is a good Rotary Club. The key things are an effective club with effective members. He spoke of the need for active involvement both within the regular club meeting place and also with external activities. He highlighted the need for clubs to have in place a plan for continuity on an on going basis rather than each year being seen in isolation. Long term planning is essential for the good of each and every Rotary Club.

Paul spoke of the need for the public perception of Rotarians in the public arena especially in the area involving children. Every club should have a Child Protection Officer and every club member should be signed up. He also would like all clubs to have a Risk Management Officer to ensure the safety of all members in whatever projects they are involved in. Paul also highlighted the need for clubs to work with each other and give assistance especially to some of the smaller clubs in our district. He also spoke of the need for clubs to address the cultural diversity within our communities.

Paul spoke of the need to effectively integrate new members into Rotary. Each new member should be assigned a mentor – something our club has done effectively over the last number of years.

Paul then spoke of the program of current world president – DK Lee from South Korea. DK Lee wants every club to commit US1000 per year for the next 3 years to once and for all rid the world of the scourge of Polio. He wants Rotary to support the children of the world. 26000 children die each day of the year. He also wants Rotary to assist in literacy programs across the world.

Paul spoke of the recent visit of DK Lee to Canberra where with 100000 Koreans now living in Australia only 1 Korean Rotarian was found to be present at his meeting – our own CS Yoon.

Paul then spoke of the use of the internet and its ability and capacity to keep Rotarians involved within each club and also within D96960.

Finally Paul spoke specifically of ongoing support for both the Shelter Box program and the Rotary Health Research Fund and also commended that clubs should endeavour to have all members as 'Centurions'.

Billy is removed to foster care and joins a gang. Psychologist tells Billy's sister that she remembers being abused herself and their dad goes to prison. Billy's mum has an affair with the psychologist. Psychologist gets a promotion.

Scenario: Mark, a college student, brings cigarettes to school. 1960 - Mark shares a smoke with the school principal out on the smoking area.

Scenario: Vinh fails high school English.

1960 - Vinh goes to Remedial English, passes and goes to college.

Civil Liberties Association files class action lawsuit against state school system and his English teacher. English is banned from core curriculum.
