The program was established in 2001, when a group of Rotarians from the Hills District, shocked by the senseless loss of young lives in a horrendous car crash on Old Northern Road, set out to help avoid a repetition of this appalling accident in a practical way and establish a program that has now had over 100,000 students participating, in venues throughout Australia.

On Thursday evening I represented our club at an Australian Citizenship Ceremony, organized by Strathfield Council, where 120 new Australian Citizens swore an oath of allegiance to our nation and were presented with Citizenship Certificates by Mayor Keith Kwon. It was wonderful to witness the pride that our new citizens expressed in becoming Australians.

Saturday saw a great turn out by a group of Young Liberals, to assist Niall King and myself with gardening duties at the Studdy MS Centre in Lidcombe. Their enthusiasm and effort for labouring duties was commendable and very much appreciated by the residents and staff.

# **Last Week's Presentation**

#### RYDA

Our guest speaker was Greg Rappo the Director of Program Development for RYDA. Kevin Beltrame introduced Greg.

Greg advised us that like many Rotary programs RYDA had a modest beginning. A local club identified the number of young people being killed on the roads as an issue and asked what can Rotary do about it. The result is the Rotary Youth Driver that the sessions can be interactive. Awareness program.

Young people aged 17 to 25 constitute 15% of the population, however, this group are over-represented in road accidents accounting for 25% of them. Some of the reasons for this are:

- over confidence and risk taking driver inexperience
- having friends as passengers
- alcohol, drugs and busy lifestyles
- a brain not fully developed.

RYDA is run with expert input from road safety bodies such as the RTA, education departments and the police. The result is a successful program which has running for more than nine years.

The format employed by the program is a one day school excursion at an off-site venue for Year 11 students. The students given a coloured wristband to identify their



- The topics covered include: Safe celebrating and fatigue
- Stopping distances
- Hazard perception
- Financial responsibilities
- Making a choice police session
- accident Personal stories of tell survivors who tell of the consequences to them, their families and the wider community, of their poor choices.

Greg advised us that the practical demonstration of stopping distances was an important part of the program. The demonstration of the law of physics that in doubling the speed of a motor vehicle you quadruple the stopping distance has a significant impact on participants.

When being split into groups students are are split into groups of 25 to 30 students so group. Each wristband has written on it "My

life- My choices". The aim of the program is to influence the attitudes and awareness of participants so that it is more likely that they will make good choices when driving, or when being driven in, a motor car.

Students are encouraged to visit the RYDA web site and the relevant address is also set out on the wristbands. This has proven to be much more effective than using handouts which were often discarded soon after receipt.

Each participant pays \$15 towards the cost of running the program. Contributions from Rotary and sponsorship meet the shortfall. BOC has been the major sponsor for four years and has recently renewed their sponsorship for another four years.

Greg advised us that RYDA Australia Limited is a not for profit company set up to ensure the relevance, currency and consistency of the program nationally. It is a professionally managed organisation that can meet with relevant government ministers and foster the development of the program at the highest levels.

Greg stressed the critical role of Rotary clubs in providing local school contacts, community credibility and volunteers to assist with the running of the program.

Greg stated that RYDA was very good for young people and very good for Rotary. In conclusion he noted that "Youth are our future, our inspiration, our responsibility". Greg was thanked by PP Doug Potter.

#### **Every Rotarian an Example to Youth**

In the Rotary calendar September is New Generations Month (formerly known as Youth Activities Month) when clubs are asked to give special attention to programs for youth and young adults. Australian clubs have always had a strong focus on youth and have participated strongly in programs such as **Youth Exchange**, **Rotaract**, **Interact** and **Scholarship** programs.

The RYLA (Rotary Youth Leadership Awards) program was initiated in Brisbane in the 1960s and was adopted as an official program of Rotary International. RYPEN (Rotary Youth Programme of Enrichment) began in D-9710 (Canberra and Southern NSW) in the early 1980s and has been adopted by most districts in Australia and New Zealand. MUNA (Model United Nations Assembly) was developed in Parkes and has also spread throughout the region and has been featured in a Rotary International Convention. RYDA (Rotary Youth Driver Awareness), started in northern Sydney, and is one of the more recent youth initiatives that has become an important program in most parts of Australia.

There are other programs such as **ROMAC** (Rotary Oceania Medical Aid for Children) that have a special emphasis on service to younger generations and each district and many clubs have their own special programs. Our own club has its Youth Awards program that it runs in conjunction with Strathfield Council.

From an individual Rotarian's point of view, the emphasis is on providing an example to which young people can aspire.

### Interact Forum held at Meriden School 27<sup>th</sup> August 2009

On Thursday 27th August 2009 the girls of the Interact Club at Meriden School, Strathfield, hosted Interactors from Caringbah High School and Granville Boys' High School to an Interact Forum with fellowship and lunch, a guest speaker and discussion on fund raising and other Interact ideas. Granville Boys' High is the newest Interact Club in District 9690 and was a direct result of the attendance of several of the boys at the RYPEN camp held at Springwood in May 2009. They were so impressed with the enthusiasm of the Meriden Interact girls who attended RYPEN that they approached Granville Rotary Club to form their own Interact Club. John Cory from the Rotary Club of Granville, who also attended the Meriden Forum, has been their mentor to help form the new Club. Fourteen enthusiastic boys travelled by train from Granville with their Co-ordinator Mr Owen Egan to attend the Forum. Also in attendance were four more enthusiastic Interactors from Caringbah High School who came with their Co-ordinator Ms Linda Brandt. The forum was organised by the executive of the Meriden Interact Club under the capable leadership of their President, Clarissa Fasanella, their Meriden Interact Co-ordinator, Ms Tanya Naticchia, and twenty enthusiastic Meriden Interactors. Rotary was also represented by Kevin Beltrame and Roger Vince from the Rotary Club of Strathfield, the sponsoring Club for the Meriden Interact Club, and special Guest Speaker, PDG Lloyd Roever, from the Rotary Club of Burwood. Apologies were received from several other invited Interact Clubs from D9690 and D9750.

PDG Lloyd gave an inspirational talk on his role in the Polio Plus campaign and his visit to India earlier this year with an international group, which included two Interactors from Jamaica. He also spoke of the leadership benefits of being an Interactor and of his own personal experience of leadership activities with young people. After a delicious lunch the Interactors let off steam on the School oval playing touch football and then returned to a discussion about increasing Interact status in schools and developing a means of communicating with each other to share fund raising ideas. A bonus for PDG Lloyd was a donation of \$60 from the Interactors to add to the Polio Plus campaign. From the enthusiasm generated from the Forum it was voted a great success and was a tribute to the organisational skills of the Meriden Interactors and all who attended.
