What a wonderful experience it was last week to listen to the presentation by Erin Greenhalgh. I am positive that everyone in attendance felt as I did, inspired and full of admiration for Erin and her achievements in arranging the transition of five Indigenous students from the remote Aboriginal community school at Ti Tree in the Northern Territory, to Meriden and Trinity Schools.

Erin, at the age of 26, is guardian to the five students, three boys attending Trinity, as well as full time carer to the two girls attending Meriden. At the same time Erin is working full time as a Year Three Teacher and is in her second year of her doctoral

Erin is seeking both physical and financial support and your board has decided to provide a weekly allowance, to the end of June 2010, to assist her in this exceptional endeavour. I also strongly encourage members to consider providing physical support if you are able to take the students out on activities on the weekends. I will be able to provide you with contact details.

District Governor Paul Reid has established a "D9690 Disaster Appeal Fund" in response to the catastrophic natural disasters that have happened in our neighbouring nations of Samoa, The Philippines. Indonesia and Vietnam, and is asking all Clubs to consider extending the hand of friendship and give their support. Rotary has demonstrated its strength in providing "second tier" support once the recovery needs have been properly assessed. DG Paul has approved the sum of \$5000 from District funds to immediately support the appeal and our club will decide shortly the level and content of our support.

From the Desert to the Beach: All in the Name of Education

Our guest speaker was Erin Greenhalgh who was introduced by PP Peter Manenti.

Her subject was 'From the Desert to the Beach: All in the Name of Education.'

Erin is the daughter of Doctor Julie Greenhalgh, Principal of Meriden.

In 2006, at the age of 24 Erin, who had graduated as a teacher, applied for a position in the teaching profession. The Northern Territory Government accepted her application and she was appointed as 2IC to an aboriginal school at Ti Tree which is 200 kilometres north of Alice Springs on the edge of the Tanami Desert. There were no shops, no mobile reception, only the school and a health clinic manned by two nurses. There were also two police officers who were responsible for Ti Tree and a substantial surrounding area. There are 15 houses in the immediate area and a number of humpies in a creek camp.

In her first year Erin looked after a class of 12 to 17 year olds. In addition to pupils from the Ti Tree community others are bussed in from settlements up to 20 kilometres away. In the first term average attendance was around five children but this had improved to 25 in the second term. In her second year Erin took over teaching children achieving an attendance of over 85%, 19 children were taken to Sydney for an eight day visit. This included a visit to Meriden School where some of the pupils

became pen pals of Meriden students. Through this relationship one of the Ti Tree pupils indicated a wish to attend Meriden so a three week trial was undertaken. This proved extremely successful and after much discussion two girls - Anthea Joe and Shamayla became pupils at Meriden at the start of 2009.

Erin is the guardian to these two girls and they live with her in Strathfield. Erin meets from her own resources the cost of housing and feeding these two girls.

Erin is also the guardian to three boys who are boarders at Trinity Grammar at Summer Hill.

Erin spoke at length about the language and culture of the aboriginal people and the impact it had upon her. She also spoke about how the girls had adapted to the 'european' ways.

Erin is now teaching at Trinity Prep

At the conclusion of her talk there was the primary class. As a reward for the much discussion about what Erin was undertaking and in what way we at Strathfield Rotary could assist.

Erin was thanked by PP Bert Houston.

Clarified the reason for the resignation of Peter Harries from the Club. Peter has transferred to the membership of the Rotary Club of New Plymouth in New Zealand. Unfortunately, the RI rules, as well as our own bylaws, allow the membership of only one Rotary Club at any time. Peter wanted to maintain membership of both Strathfield and New Plymouth because he spends his time in both places. All avenues have been investigated but, unfortunately, it has not been possible to change the rules on membership. When Peter recently joined the RC of New Plymouth he was under the impression he could be a member of both Rotary Clubs. When his name was submitted to RI in Evanston by the Secretary of the RC of New Plymouth, without reference to RC Strathfield, Peter's name was automatically deleted from the membership of Strathfield. Unfortunately, this is a weakness in the RI system of membership changes. The membership change was only discovered after a reconciliation of the Club membership revealed the absence of Peter's name on the RI list. Brother Paul Hough, former headmaster of St Joseph's, and Andrew Penfold, an old boy, were responsible for setting up the programme at Joeys, and the girls school at Kincoppal - Rose Bay.

With reference to the number of students at Joeys, the correct number is 40 pupils, not 25.

Andrew Penfold has since been made the Chairman of the Australian Indigenous Education Committee. In reference to the 20 million dollars, this was not for Joeys, but will be administered by the Indigenous Committee.

I have arranged for Erin to contact Richard Quinn, the Chairman of Št Joseph's Development and Foundation Committee, to explain the situation, and see if he can be of any assistance.

I have arranged for a copy of the College News, which has more about the Indigenous Programme, to be made available.

- 12. You are notified of events and your support is sought for Rotary activities.

- 16. The Treasurer manages, *inter alia*, your dinner fees.

- 20. You share in Rotary fellowship.

"Teenager of the Year"

District Governor Elect Jim Stamford of Padstow Club at the District Assembly prior to his year (1979-80) asked for ideas for a new program for Youth to mark the 75th Anniversary of Rotary International.

The Youth Service Committee headed by Barry Bullivant of Granville Rotary Club, Ken Nicholls, also of Granville Rotary Club, and another couple of Rotarians met and the following concept of a Youth Award for teenagers, not recognized by other awards, was suggested.

This award would recognize those between the ages of 13 to 18 and the criteria would be for Community Service, bearing in mind that most would be students. Scholastic ability was not a high priority like other awards - Community Service was the main aim.

The above suggestions were agreed to and adopted by the District and the first Award was made the following year.

In later years the award was changed into a slightly different concept as it is today with a name change to

R.O.Y.A. (Recognition of Youth Award).


