#### Water for Life

Our guest speaker was Dr Michael Storey, a microbiologist with Sydney Water. Dr Storey was introduced by Paolo Giammarco

Water for Life is an ongoing project whose ultimate aim is to secure adequate water for the population of the Sydney basin for the foreseeable future. This project has 4 components-

- DAMS A series of water storage dams across the Sydney basin. The largest is Warragamba which holds by far the greatest amount of water. Other dams are at Cataract, Avon, Nepean and Woronora. rebates for people to install Additional water is available from the Shoalhaven area south of Sydney.
- RECYCLING Secondary treatment reduce leakage from the of water for use in toilets, car washing and garden use. This is currently in operation in Newington (the Olympic suburb) and the newly developed housing area of Rouse ongoing education program Hill. The next major project is Hoxton Park. directed at all users to There are also major recycling projects being undertaken with large businessusers of water. The Nominating Committee for President of RI has selected Kalyan Banerjee of Rotary Club of Vapi, Gujarat, India as President for 2011-12. He will become president-nominee if there are no challenging candidates on 1 October.

Banerjee has been a Rotarian since 1972 and is a director of India's largest agrochemical manufacturer. Previously he has served as a director of RI and a trustee of The Rotary Foundation and in many other leadership roles. In particular, he has served as a member of the International PolioPlus Committee and has represented Rotary at meetings of the World Health Organization and UNICEF. He is keen to see Rotary International become the world's most important NGO.

He will be the first RI president from India since Rajendra Saboo in 1991-92.
