Our guest speaker was Andrew Scipione Commissioner of Police, who was introduced by Peter Smith.

The Commissioner started by stating how pleased he was to be present in the company of fellow police officers and members of Rotary. He thanked the Club for the significant effort involved in organising the Police Officer of the Year Awards night.

The Commissioner advised us that he was always inspired when he saw the Rotary motto 'Service Above Self'. He said that this was also a foundation block of the New South Wales Police Force. Police officers are happy to strive to serve the community without the expectation of personal accolades.

The Commissioner said that he was very proud to hear the nominations read out and to find out what the men and women of the local command areas had been doing. He congratulated the finalists on their courage and their contributions to the community. He thanked the family and friends of the police officers for their support of the officers in what was often a difficult job. He also pointed out that the support of the community was critical for police officers in their endeavours to reduce crime and improve public safety.

NSW Premier supports RYDA

Premier Nathan Rees attended the RYDA venue at Penrith on 24th July to meet the 100,000th student to pass through the RYDA program. While there, the premier presented a cheque for \$20,000 to assist more students in Western Sydney to take part. The contribution by the government is designed to help families who may have difficulty meeting the cost of attending the program. The grant will help schools in Western Sydney provide transport to the training facility. Premier Rees outlined the benefits of the program and congratulated Rotary on its "commitment to saving the lives of young people on our roads."

Apart from these initiatives the police are out there doing their job 24/7 in apprehending offenders. The Commissioner advised us that he was confident that any fresh challenges arising in the future would be met by the Police Force.

In conclusion the Commissioner stated that he greatly valued the input of the community, represented through Rotary, in presenting the Police Officer of the Year Awards. The Commissioner was thanked by Bert Houston.

Police Officer of the Year Awards

MC PP Doug Potter gave a warm welcome to the many visitors who were present. He later thanked the several sponsors who helped with the cost of the function.

President Kevin welcomed distinguished guests to the 7th Police Officer of the Year presentation and told the gathering that the occasion was Rotary's way of recognising the excellent work undertaken by local police in dealing with crime and community safety issues. He indicated that their dedication was unquestionable and the Rotary Club of Strathfield was proud to acknowledge the service they gave to the community.

President Elect Peter Smith introduced the Police Officer finalists and later thanked Connie Galletta and Suzanne Freund for organising a very successful evening. He thanked Burwood and Flemington Commands for organising the finalists and supplying detailed information about each candidate.

The Finalists

Senior Constable Andrew Borychevich is attached to the Burwood Highway Patrol and has had over 22 years police experience. He was responsible for the arrest of six armed robbers, in two separate incidents, within two days in 2008. His peers acknowledge his courage, persistence and bravery. He is a recipient of the Commissioners Medal of Valour.

Roster Officer Linda Christenson is responsible for planning and producing a six-weekly roster for over 200 Police for the Flemington LAC while adhering to all legal and industrial requirements. Linda is a dedicated and loyal employee who handles what is a dynamic and demanding role with professionalism.

Leading Senior Constable Steven Coe was recognised by his peers at the Flemington LAC as an admirable and dedicated Police Officer. His natural leadership skills, work ethic and willingness to guide and assist all colleagues were deemed exceptional. He is extremely approachable and provides enormous support to all officers irrespective of rank and experience.

Detective Leading Senior Constable Michael Egan has been the lead investigator at Flemington into serious crime for the past 12 months. This included the double homicide of two women at Auburn, the attempted murder of an Asian student and investigations into ATM ram raids and armed robberies. He is described as being a passionate and motivated investigator.

Constable Robert Lorenc and Constable Christopher Page are attached to the Burwood Proactive Crime Team and were jointly responsible for the arrest and prosecution of three known criminals who were active within the Burwood CBD. They also spent many months in a covert investigation into a large scale drug manufacturing operation which resulted in convictions and the confiscation of three Harley Davidson motorcycles, a Porsche and a home unit. In another case a \$1million trade mark counterfeiting operation was successfully prosecuted by Constable Lorenc.

Sergeant Allan Simpson is attached to the Flemington Commuter Crime Unit which operates at Lidcombe and services five of the local area commands on and around the public railway network. He was recognised for his ability to motivate staff to perform at the highest level. His knowledge and work ethic gives him the great respect of his peers, fellow Sergeants and senior management.

Leading Senior Constable Lance Stebbing has been attached to the Flemington LAC for over 11 years. Constable Stebbing was recently involved in the arrest of an armed offender who had just robbed the Regents Park Hotel. He attended the hotel with other Police and confronted the offender exiting the hotel. The offender had a loaded shot gun. After a chase on foot Constable Stebbing tackled him and effected the arrest. LSC Stebbings' bravery and courage shown that night were acknowledged by his peers and the victims of the hotel robbery.

Constable Michael Taylor is attached to the Burwood Proactive Crime Team and has consistently achieved above average statistics in break-and-enter incidents, person searches, drink driving and drug offences, resulting in numerous arrests. While recently off duty he was first at a fatal car accident where he tried his best to save the life of a teenage victim. For such a young Constable his efforts should be commended.

Leading Senior Constable Attila Yilmaz is attached to Burwood LAC and for the past few years has organised a Christmas lunch for victims of crime including displaced women and children. He has organised local restaurants and businesses in supplying meals and presents (mainly toys and gifts). Hundreds of women and children have been recipients of his hard work, dedication and generosity. His actions have brought the business community, Police and victims of crime together and, as result, has brought credit to himself and to all Police officers in Burwood.

President Kevin invited Commissioner Andrew Scipione to present the Awards and Perpetual Trophies.

Police Officers of the Year

Senior Constable Paul Wearne is currently an acting sergeant within the Burwood Proactive Crime Team and is responsible for training and mentoring the numerous staff attached to the unit. He has assisted them in gaining valuable knowledge which has resulted in some significant high quality arrests that have been successfully prosecuted. S/C Wearne is a professional and dedicated officer who has fulfilled his duty to the NSW Police Service and the local community with diligence and pride.

Constable James Whelan is attached to the Flemington LAC Anti Theft Team and is recognised for his excellent communication skills, his professional attitude and one who takes pride in his work. Constable Whelan recently prevented an inmate from committing self harm (the inmate had attempted to hang himself and then suffered an epileptic fit). James administered first aid until he recovered and then arrested him! In another instance this Constable saved the life of a stabbing victim by putting his fingers inside one deep wound and bandaged several other wounds, all by the side of the road.



Unity Walk


On Sunday August 30th at 12 noon The 4km Unity Walk in aid of Parkinson's Disease research will take place around Sydney Olympic Park.
