And so, this Rotary year has ended almost as quickly as it had begun; it has been a great ride. Let's reflect on the year that's been.

We started the year with the following Objectives:


- 1. Strengthen our club fundamentals

- Embrace more social media channels, and be very active in them
- Greater shared leadership amongst Board and in Club Meetings
- 3. Set the foundations for sustainable success
- Ensure solid financial health so we can serve
- Focus our service on local community needs first
- Improve our public profile and sentiment in the local community, so they know we can help serve them

...and with the following Goals:

- 1. Double our membership!
- Focus on young working professionals
- Grow our female membership
- Focus on parents in local schools
- 2. Establish a club sponsorship program
- Target: \$20,000.00 in local business sponsorship p.a.
- Not aimed at existing Club Members!
- 3. Be the best club in the district
- As measured by the Rotary Club Health Check

So, how did we go? Well, we didn't achieve everything we aspired to, but I think we moved the needle well into the right direction.

As far as our **objectives** are concerned, I believe we have strengthened our club fundamentals, with the recent addition of many new, energetic, and some very young, members, and our capacity to serve has certainly improved as a result.



In modernising our club, well... perhaps the more 'relaxed' and interactive meeting formats is the most significant change. I think it has encouraged membership amongst our visitors and guests, and positioned us as an energetic, modern club.

And lastly, setting the foundation for sustainable success I believe is assured. As well as being financially healthy, we did focus most of our efforts on local Strathfield community needs. As well as securing a President Elect (thanks PP Joseph Saad for facilitating this), we also now have a President Nominee – Arie Pappas locked in.

Let's take a look now at our goals.

Did we double membership? No. That would have required adding net 33 new members in the year. So why did we try for that? Well, big results can only be achieved by setting big goals; it makes you think differently about the challenge. We did however add 12 new members this year! Would we have done this without this BHAG (big hairy audacious goal)? Probably not. This was a great result, taking our membership back up to 45, in an environment where Rotary in general is slowly losing members. My special thanks to **Gulian Vaccari**, Membership Development Chair and **Arie Pappas**, Director Youth Service, who together were responsible for nominating almost every new member. Great effort!

We didn't end up establishing a club sponsorship program this year. I still believe it's a good idea; perhaps we can achieve this in the coming year?

And, are we the best club in the district (as measured by the Rotary Club Health Check?) We won't know until we complete our last survey and compare this to other clubs in the District. Does it really matter however what the score says? Not really. It's about paying attention to the elements of what makes a good club

and trying to continuously improve. I believe it's 'mission accomplished' in this regard.

We also resolved to support the following organisations in our community service program this year:

...and this we did with great effect!

Through several great events we raised a total of \$14,700 for **Australian Rotary Health**, in support of their youth mental health research efforts.







Partnering with **The Catherine Sullivan Centre** to host and run a gala dinner event, together we raised the \$50,000 needed to establish and run a new phonemic awareness program for their hearing-impaired students. A great result! This was in addition to \$2.350 raised at the Strathfield Spring Fair BBQ.

And finally, with a Carols BBQ, and then later with the help of Superman, as a club we raised a total of \$10,000 for **Chalmers Road School**, to go towards the purchase of a wheelchair accessible bus for their more physically disabled students.

Yes, we absolutely delivered on our service partner goals this year. I think we made a difference.





Of course, as a club we did so much more, including: many other BBQs in support of various causes, graffiti removal days, Red Shield Appeal support, Bowelscan kit distribution and collection, Interact and Rotaract club support, interschool debate, RYPEN, RYLA and NYSF student sponsoring, and much, much more. What's truly amazing is that Mr Perpetual Motion, **PP Peter Smith** has been at the centre of almost all of these. You're a volunteer champion, Pete. Great effort – as always.

Perhaps our highlight club event was the **Indian Cultural Night**, organised by **Prabhat Sinha** – Director International Service – and his lovely wife, Neena. It was a great, fun night, where we raised significant funds for distribution to two charities. Oh, and I can't forget our Christmas Party, where we played some party games most likely never played in a Rotary club ever before!

I'd like to wrap up by making some special mentions. **PP Raymond McCluskie** has been fantastic this year as a Programs Chair. We had great and entertaining speakers every week, as well as excellent transfer meetings arranged, including twice to the Ryde TAFE training restaurant, and a visit to Old Government House in Parramatta for a ghost tour. Thanks so much, Raymond – great stuff!

I'd like to also thank the person many of us refer to as the glue of the club — **Secretary Rod McDougall**. Rod is the consummate 'behind the scenes' guy that make's sure that everything just works. Whether it's board agendas and minutes, or new member packs, or direction on protocol and procedure, or just general advice, Rod is always there. Thanks for the tremendous support, Rod!

Service Above Self

It has been suggested that I might highlight, in a little more detail, some of the club's service activities:

I am pleased to report that the club's **graffiti removal program** had several successful and productive clean-up days during the year. The success of the year is down to about ten or so Rotarians who participated on a regular and energetic basis. We also had over 20 community volunteers – including Interactors, Rotaractors, Girl Guides and former Rotarians active at various times during 2017-2018.

As we have significant hardware and consumables on hand this year we did not apply for the annual \$2,000 Grant from re the NSW Attorney General & Justice Department. This will change during 2018-19!

We did however receive a \$750 one-off grant from the NSW Attorney General which enabled the purchase of an additional electric spray unit. It is important to remember that the club's Graffiti Removal project, while being a full blown program of Strathfield Rotary, it is entirely funded external of Strathfield Rotary. No funds or fundraising will ever be diverted from the clubs other charitable and community donations.

Strathfield Rotary once again coordinated the local **Red Shield Appeal** – as we have done for several decades. The Red Shield Appeal started in Australia in 1965 – and in Strathfield about 10 years later.

The Strathfield Zone 2017 Red Shield Appeal – which now incorporates the appeal in nearby Concord – was again extremely well supported by Strathfield Rotarians and their families - and for the first time by Concord Rotarians. The 2018 combined Strathfield/Concord Appeal raised \$26,626.45. While the result was down slightly on the 2017 Appeal (just under \$30,000). It was still a great result. The nationwide appeal raised some \$5 million.

The support of Rotary is a given – but we should also acknowledge the wonderful and regular support of Strathfield Council. Council allow us the use of the Town Hall.



their community bus, erect banners and even run, at their cost, a gold coin BBQ in support of the Appeal. But the doorknock could not happen without the wonderful 295+ students from the 6 local high schools.

Many thanks to the several Strathfield Rotarians who helped in the Rotary's **BowelCare** program in 2018. This year we were allocated 20 pharmacies, from Strathfield to Villawood – the participating pharmacies sold 170 kits – with sales \$2,550. But more importantly the BowelCare program may have led to the early detection and successful treatment in some – and the peace of mind for the majority.

The Concord Growers Market; while the activities of **Homebush Boys Interact Club and Strathfield Rotaract Club** are mentioned elsewhere it would be remiss if we did not mention the assistance afforded their fundraising activities by the **Rotary Club of Concord.**

On the second and third Sunday of each month 2 teams of four members either set-up or pack-up the various stalls, marquees and safety barriers. The Rotaractors and Interactors take turn about each month.

In recompense for their efforts they receive the proceeds of the (on the day) charity bucket. The exit bucket can yield \$400 to \$800 each Market day – in excess of \$10,000 pa. Each club then nominates their chosen charity. Since 2014 the two clubs have supported **Shelter Box**, **The Smith Family**, **the Salvo's**, **PCYC**, **the Leukaemia Foundation**, **Concord Hospital**, **Chalmers Road School**, **Camp Quality**, **Exodus Foundation**, **Mission Australia**, **NSW Surf Lifesaving**, **Anzac Research Institute etc.** – with minimum donations of \$500 and maximum of \$2,000 to their recipients. Since 2014 a combined total of some of \$40,000 has been raised by both youth clubs from this source.

MUNA is a significant international Rotary youth program in which senior high school students develop an awareness of the United Nations and the countries




they represent at a simulated UN Assembly.

Treasurer's Report

It was a pleasure to be Club Treasurer for Rotary year 2017-2018, and working with a great team, led by President Rick, continuing the Club's fine history as the peak community organisation in our locality.

The financial report is to 30 June, 2018, and there remain a small number of transactions to be accounted for before being presented for audit. Our interim result is a deficit of \$5,989.34. The audited financial report will be distributed to the membership prior to the AGM in December, 2018.

We were blessed by accumulated member's funds totalling \$19,992.83, from past years, and applied those funds to the Club's activities support of youth and beneficial gifts.

Our total revenue for the year to date is \$112,237.35.

In comparison with the past year of \$117, 545.67. We are carrying forward to the next Rotary year a Community Grant from Strathfield Council of \$6,000.00, to be expended on designated projects that could not be started in the current year.

Our total expenditure for the year to date is \$118,226.69.

During the year we incurred extra expenditure for Club's weekly meetings with the closure of the Strathfield Golf Club House, and the relocation to Massey Park Golf Club were an added cost to our dinner meetings together with a late payable from previous years added to the deficit.

I am pleased to report that the Club's support for youth, and other beneficiaries was as follows:

A successful lawyer who wished to capture in a professional club the same friendly spirit he had felt in the small towns of his youth, Paul Harris formed the Rotary Club of Chicago, on 23 February 1905.

By 1921, Rotary clubs had been formed on six continents, the organisation adopting the Rotary International name a year later.

Founded by Arch Klumph with a donation of \$26.50 The Rotary Foundation was formed in 1917. In order to finance ever increasing

sponsorship demands, the trustees sought new ways of funding and a plan encouraging individual Rotarians to give \$US1,000 as a gift to the

Foundation was adopted - a donor being named and publicly recognised as a 'Paul Harris Fellow'.

Today, Rotary clubs and individual Rotarians throughout the world use a PHF award to recognise the special contribution of a Rotarian or community member or to honour a family member or as a vehicle to donate funds to The Rotary Foundation.
